
### **In Unison (grades 4-7)**

Approximately 42 people stayed after Church for the Congregational Meeting. Moderator, Penny Higgins opened the meeting thanking past Moderator, Tim Wilcox for his years of service and all those that have served on teams and committees. Pastor Karen offered prayer.

### **OCTOBER MEETING MINUTES**

- A motion was made by Tim Wilcox to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the October meeting and approve as printed in the newsletter, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Phil Etgen, motion carried.

### **TREASURER'S REPORT – Brandy Powell**

  - Missions - \$23,142 for 2025 above and beyond operating funds
  - Offering totals are behind budget for the year by \$20,668 – however, we spent \$34,438 on items outside of the planned budget.
  - Certificate of Deposit balances are: United Midwest Savings Bank \$252,369 – Huntington \$237,823 and United Church Funds is \$66,425.
- Mary Headley made a motion to accept the treasurer's report as presented, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Gaye Earick, motion carried.

- Also, based on a recommendation by our accounting firm, we are looking for someone else to help count the weekly offering. Thanks to all that have been helping out in the meantime.


