

Betty introduced our guest speaker, Kathy Bow, chairwoman of Habit for Humanity/Restore, Logan Co. Habitat was started in 1976 - every person deserves decent housing. Habitat was started in Logan County by Dr. Roger & Rachael Kauffman. 31 homes have been built in Logan County. Kathy oversees most aspects of Habitat & Restore, building of houses, insurance, financing. Restore sells high quality used furniture, household items, etc. This money is used to help finance building of homes and furnishing them. Homeowners have to work off a portion of the cost of home - they have a 30 year mortgage, no interest. Volunteers are always welcome.

Lauren & Sandra led us in singing "In the Garden". Business meeting was opened with reading of minutes, treasurer reported \$1,323.19.

Mary H showed banners she had made #1 with names of ladies involved with Missionary Aide - #2 programs for 2024-2025. Betty explained "The Mission Corner". Judy explained our September school project - donations can be given/donated by September 22. Kathy & Vicki made a motion to give \$150 to Habitat - \$150 to School Project. October project - Food Pantry - Carol H is our rep for the Food Pantry.

Joys and concerns were shared. Pastor Karen led us in prayer.

Meeting closed with the Aide Benediction.

Kathy & Mary were the committee for the day. Eleven ladies and one guest enjoyed a delicious buffet.






Nursery Volunteers Wanted
